# Research Infrastructures WP 2013 e-Infrastructure plans

- Focus on Research & Education Networking
  - Bridge GÉANT into H2020 while...
  - ...adapting to continuously evolving needs of e-Science (capacity, clouds, global connectivity etc) and
  - implementing the GEG recommendations
- Up to €39 million budget

### Goal 1 - Support knowledge communities

**Traffic increase**: x3 over the last 12 month; superior to internet organic growth;

**AAI**: EduGAIN development, adjust to data protection legislation

Cloud and mobility; pan-European cloud service model Large pan-European users: one-stop-shop model



## WP2013: consultation conclusions (2)

### Goal 2: Expand Knowledge Communities

Openness: to new users and partners e.g. with open calls for research

**Digital Divide:** commitment to the cost sharing model and exploring additional measures

International connectivity should become part of the core activities (in addition to international development aid)



## WP2013: consultation conclusions (3)

#### Goal 3: Push the State of the Art

Innovation with industry: mobile roaming and its application to sensor networks

Open advanced virtualised testbeds (both logically mixed and separated with Géant network)

Innovative business models, e.g. cloud;

Advanced federated services and trust: eduGAIN

Maintaining a balance between operation and innovation

The community has the potential to create spin-off to industry



## WP2013: consultation conclusion (4)

### Goal 4: Reorganize for Change

Structural changes: aligned H2020 timing

Financial support: no change in FP7; considers changes in H2020; NRENs committed to co-funding

Global coordination for better synchronisation and synergy UK initiative to improve e-RI (£ 165 M total, £ 26 M for JANET)



### WP2013: Next Steps

#### WP2013:

Integration of the inputs into a draft WP (Feb-March)

Draft text to next RIC

Inter-Service consultation (May-June)

WP approval to the Committee (June)

Publication in July 2012. Deadline end November

Regular progress review of GEG roadmap (next meeting towards end of the year)


# The Multi-annual Financial Framework 2014-2020: Commission's proposals of 29 June 2011






## Significant re-distribution in key policy areas

### What is Horizon 2020

Commission proposal for a 80 billion euro research and innovation funding programme (2014-20)

Part of proposals for next EU budget, complementing Structural Funds, education, etc.

A core part of Europe 2020, Innovation Union & European Research Area:

- Responding to the economic crisis to invest in future jobs and growth
- Addressing peoples' concerns about their livelihoods, safety and environment.
- Strengthening the EU's global position in research, innovation and technology



### What's new

A single programme bringing together three separate programmes/initiatives\*

*More innovation,* from research to retail, all forms of innovation

**Focus on societal challenges** facing EU society, e.g. health, clean energy and transport

**Simplified access**, for all companies, universities, institutes in all EU countries and beyond.

\*The 7th research Framework Programme (FP7), innovation aspects of Competitiveness and Innovation Framework Programme (CIP), EU contribution to the European Institute of Innovation and Technology (EIT)



# **Priority 1** Excellent science

### Why:

World class science is the foundation of tomorrow's technologies, jobs and wellbeing

Europe needs to develop, attract and retain research talent Researchers need access to the best infrastructures



# From FP7 to Horizon 2020 – Research Infrastructures

Endow Europe with world-class research infrastructures which are accessible to all researchers in Europe and beyond and fully exploit their potential for scientific advance and innovation

#### High level objectives:

- Developing the European Research Infrastructures for 2020 and beyond
- Fostering the innovation potential of Research Infrastructures & their human capital
- Reinforcing European Research Infrastructures policy and international cooperation

#### Horizon 2020 novelties:

- New activities to support the implementation and operation of world-class infrastructures such as ESFRI infrastructures
- Continuation of the successful FP7 Integrating Activities
- Reinforcement of e-infrastructures to support compute- and data-intensive research
- New objective of better exploiting the innovation potential and human capital of infrastructures
